

Reflection From Rev'd Rosie:

In the Gospel reading today we witness two things. The arrest of John and in a sense, a whisper of what awaits Jesus. The first hint that to follow Jesus could be considered a wrongdoing in the eyes of the established authority of the day.

Secondly, Jesus begins his ministry as he calls fishermen to set down their nets and to follow him. Indeed to "fish for men". Incredibly, they understand this instruction and follow Jesus. I wonder whether we hear the call to leave our ordinary lives of habit when we hear the call, and do so without complex questioning into the worth of it. Diving into the depths of what we may lose if we follow the call on our lives.

An awareness settled on Jesus after his baptism in the Jordan. An awareness that the Holy Spirit was with and within him. Through the grace of the Holy Spirit, we are enabled. We are called. We are uplifted and we are guided. As a child takes first steps to a parent, in total faith, so must we. As we step forward in understanding, and with acceptance that God will not only guide us, we are also gifted the grace that we will be caught when we fall.

In essence, all we need do, is take the step. Rev. Rosie Wynter

ABM Reflection:

What we do matters. It matters to ourselves, each other and to God. The people of Nineveh responded to Jonah's warning of destruction by donning sackcloth, sitting in ashes and going without food or water. The king hopes that if his citizens turned from their evil ways then God would change his mind. God does change his mind. Is God capricious or does God hear and respond to his people? In much the same way, Jesus calls for our repentance and belief in the gospel. The time is near when we will have to choose to follow Jesus just like the fisherfolk he called.

- Pray that we have ears to listen to the urgency of God's call to us to live in the faith of Jesus Christ. We ask that we too could leave all things that weigh us down and follow Jesus.
