#### **Reflection From Rev'd Rosie:**

Gifting others a moment where they experience transfigured realities and the light of reformed love which can transform people's lives. We so often underestimate the power of love and its impact on the journey of many as they tread the fragile path of life. Blessings in all things, and may God's light transform any burden you may carry.
