Dear People of Faith

In our Gospel message today for Easter 3, we hear how the Risen Jesus appears to his Disciples behind locked doors. We hear how his Risen body was not just a figment of their imagination or a ghost. The disciples touched him. He ate food. Yet, his Risen Body was not merely a restored human body like Lazarus (John 11). He was able to appear and disappear because Jesus' resurrected body was immortal.

The timing of today's Gospel account is that many days may have elapsed between verses 43 and 44 because Jesus and his followers travelled to Galilee and back before his Ascension. In the Book of Acts, Luke makes it clear that Jesus spent 40 days with his disciples between his Resurrection and Ascension – that is nearly 6 weeks.

The Law of Moses (Torah), the Prophets, and the Psalms is a way to describe the entire Old Testament (Hebrew Scriptures). In other words, the entire Old Testament points to the Messiah, the Christ of God. For example, his role as prophet was foretold in Deuteronomy (18.15-20), his sufferings were prophesied in Psalm 22 and Isaiah 53. His resurrection was predicted in Psalm 16.9-11 and Isaiah 53.10, 11.

Jesus opened people's minds to understand the Scriptures. The Holy Spirit continues to do this in our lives today when we study the Bible. Have you ever wondered how to understand a difficult Bible passage? Besides reading surrounding passages, asking other people and consulting reference works, pray that the Holy Spirit will open your mind to understand, giving you needed insight to put God's word into action in your life.

Luke wrote to the Greek-speaking world. He wanted them to know that Christ's message of God's love and forgiveness should

go out to all the world. We too are called to not ignore the worldwide scope of Christ's gospel. God wants all the world to hear the Good News of salvation.

Readings for Today

Acts 3.12-20 Peter had an audience and he capitalized on the opportunity to share Jesus. He presented his message by telling who Jesus is, how he had been rejected, why their rejection of him was fatal, and what they needed to do to change the situation.

Psalm 4 – The godly are those who are faithful and devoted to God. We too can be confident that God will hear our prayers.

1 John 2.15-17; 3.1-6 John writes to encourage believers that God's life in us enables us to love our fellow believers.

Luke 24.36b-48 Jesus appears to his followers behind locked doors and continues to open the scriptures for them to explain what is happening. He reminds them they are his witnesses and he is going to send them the Holy Spirit to strengthen and sustain them after his Ascension. Although he will no longer be with them in the world he will be with them through His Spirit. The Holy Spirit is the Spirit of Christ.

How are you feeling about your journey of faith? I encourage us all to keep a Spiritual Journal – talk around the dinner table, to continue to grow through our journey. Spiritual journals are available for you at the back of each of our churches.

Did you know that one of the most common complaints about Christian Faith in the 21st Century is that some people say it makes no difference!

People see no significant difference between the way those of us with an active faith deal with life and the way those without faith deal with their lives.

So, it is a fair question.

Around the world faith communities that engage seriously in the transformation of everyday living find that people take them more seriously. Perhaps far more importantly, they find new depth and meaning in their own lives.

One tool for this transformation is to use a personal Rule of Life. Typically a Rule of Life covers 3 areas of Work, Study and Prayer. The twin keys to this process are to keep it simple and to make it specific to your own personal situation. No-one else needs to know the contents of your Rule of Life – or even that you may have one.

The following process may be of assistance:

For each of the three domains imagine how you would like that aspect of your life to be in 12 month's time.

Typically a Rule of Life covers 3 areas of Work, Study and Prayer. Review how your life presently is in that domain. What might you change, add or delete to move from how things are now – to the way you would like them to be in a year's time.

WORK – how am I going to act with God's compassion in my daily life during the next 12 months?

STUDY – how am I going to increase my understanding of the faith in its relevance to life during the next 12 months?

PRAYER – How am I going to express my relationship with God in prayer and worship during the next 12 months?

A Rule of Life can shape our life into having a Faith that makes a difference in the real world where we live 24 hours a day, 7 days a week.

Finally, as this week we remembered HRH Prince Philip, the Duke of Edinburgh and his life of service, I offer you this prayer for the repose of his soul from Bishop Murray.

A Prayer for the Duke of Edinburgh 'Well done, thou good and faithful servant: enter thou into the joy of thy lord.' Matthew 25.21.

God of majesty,
give rest to your servant Philip
who, having served his Queen and country
has passed from this life,
full of years yet strong in spirit.
As we give thanks for his life
as Prince and husband,
as Consort and family man,
we pray that all that he has done
may continue to bear fruit
in the lives of individuals

and the life of this nation, to your honour and glory, through Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen.

May God bless each and every one of you in your faith journey that your lives may be enriched in Christ.
