Dear People of Faith,

Today we celebrate the Feast of Pentecost at *Hazeldene*, Coopers Shoot and share in the hospitality of Jack and Hilda Richards. We are so blessed to have such generous people in our Community, like Hilda and Jack. We are so blessed to be together today in unity as a Community at our Combined Parish Service - in such a beautiful part of the world.

Pentecost is the celebration of the Holy Spirit – the breath of God. And nothing breathes more strongly than the promise and presence of the Spirit as described in John Chapters 14 to 17 in the "Farewell Discourse" of Jesus. We have heard portions of these Chapters during the last several Sundays of Easter.

Jesus promises the coming of the Spirit, the Advocate (parakletos). He explains that the mission and sending of the Spirit occurs by his authority and he assures us that this Spirit – the Holy Spirit – can be trusted as true. The Spirit comes from the Father and the Spirit exercises its mission – not in bearing witness to itself – but rather in testifying to the Good News (the Gospel) already made known in the Resurrection of the Son (15.26).

So, the witness of the Spirit has a two-fold focus. First focus is in the Spirit's witness on behalf of Jesus. And that witness about Jesus has at least two aspects. It is a witness that the Mission of the Father and the Son has indeed been completed.

The cross was not some travesty or failure of God's intent.

The Word became flesh and dwelled among us. It was necessary that the Son be "lifted up" on the Cross so as to confirm the

depth of the Father's love for the world (Jn.3.14-17).

And it was at the point of being lifted up on the Cross – just before he died, that Jesus the Son of God, declared the fulfilment of that mission and said [Gk 'tetelestai]'- 'It is finished' - "It is accomplished".

A second aspect of this witness is that the Spirit gives power to the community of believers – not to identify themselves as abandoned, or forsaken, but rather as *empowered – Holy Spirit powered!* They are sent to bear witness to the world - that through the Life, Death and Resurrection of Jesus – God's love has indeed been made real and present for all the world to see.

"For God sent the Son into the world, not for the purpose of standing in judgment over the world, but in order that through him the world might be saved". (John 3:17).

READINGS FOR TODAY

Acts 2.1-21 - Pentecost was held 50 days after Passover – and was also called "The Festival of First Harvest". It was one of three major annual festivals (Deuteronomy 16:16), a festival of thanksgiving for the harvested crops. Jesus was crucified at Passover time and he ascended 40 days after his Resurrection. The Holy Spirit came 50 days after the Resurrection, 10 days after the Ascension of Christ. Jews of many nations had gathered in Jerusalem for this festival. Therefore, Peter's speech was given to an international audience, and it resulted in a worldwide harvest of new believers – the first converts to Christianity.

Psalm 104:26-36 – This Psalm is about appreciating God through creation. God not only creates, but maintains the Creation and the Lord's care is the source of our joy.

Romans 8.22-27 – Christians have hope for future glory and look forward to the new heaven and new earth that God has promised, and they wait for God's new order that will free the world from sin, sickness and evil. In the meantime, Christians go with Christ into the world where they heal people's bodies and

souls and fight against the negative effects of sin in the world. We look ahead with hope and trust toward that complete change of body and personality that lies beyond this life, when we will be like Christ. As a believer we are not left to our own resources to cope with problems. Even when we don't know the right words to pray, the Holy Spirit prays with and for us, and God answers. We are to ask the Holy Spirit to intercede for us "in harmony with God's will" and then we bring our requests to God, we are to trust that God will always do what is best – even if the answer is No to some of our questions.

John 15.26-27; 16.4b-15 – Once again Jesus offers hope. The Holy Spirit gives strength to endure the unreasonable hatred and evil in the world and the hostility many have toward those who live in Christ. Jesus uses two names for the Holy Spirit "Advocate" and "Spirit of Truth". Spirit of Truth points to the teaching, illuminating, and reminding work of the Spirit. The Holy Spirit ministers to both the head and the heart, and both dimensions are important. God wants us to know we are not alone. We have the Holy Spirit to comfort and sustain us, to teach us truth and to help us in our Christian journey.

My friends, this following week is what is known as an Ember week. It is appropriate for prayers to be said for the Ordained Ministry of the Church and you can use the *Litany for Ministry* on Page 192 of A Prayer Book for Australia or *Litany for the Holy Spirit* on page 196.

I also offer you the following Prayer for Ministry:

God our Shepherd,
In every generation you call
Ministers of your word and sacraments.
Equip them to preach the gospel,
To care for your people
And to show forth the fruit of the spirit in their lives;
In the name of Jesus our Saviour. Amen. (APBA p.211).

May God bless each and every one of you, and those whom you love.
