Property Sales Update

Parishioners will be aware of recent sales or proposed sales of properties in the Parish, namely the Rectory in Mullumbimby which has been sold, St Aidan's at Eureka which has been sold, and St Oswald's at Broken Head which yet to be sold.

The Diocese of Grafton has made an assessment regarding the large amount needed to meet historical abuse claims for the foreseeable future and the available resources across the Diocese to meet those claims. In past years these claims have been met by contributions from a number of Parishes and Diocesan funds. For the current needs they expect to sell any available non ministry property, in addition to contributions from Parishes and levies on Trust Funds of some Parishes.

For our Parish, in addition to the properties mentioned above, the Diocese has decided to sell the land at 119 to 121 Jonson St Byron Bay in the near future.

Over the last few months our Parish Council has written to the Diocese on several occasions putting forward our objections to the sale of the Jonson St property and our vision for its use in the future ministry of the Parish. However, the Diocese sees very little alternative given the amount needed, to settle the abuse claims. For the sale of all of the properties, our Parish will receive varying percentages of the proceeds which will increase our level of Endowment Trust Fund, which can be invested to provide some income.

We will provide further information once more is known about final sales proceeds.
