Following are just some snippets from my Draft Report for the Bishop and Parish Council, following my time with you over the past four months:

Unity. While there has been an acceptance of amalgamation, there is still a way to go in discovering what this means in practice. There is still a degree of suspicion, resentment and misunderstanding among some parishioners as people journey through the inevitable changes from the past. Currently maintaining five worship centres is not conducive to overcoming these issues and while these continue to function similarly as they did when there were 3 parishes, they will continue to frustrate a sense of unity.

The Byron region is an international, national, and local 'go to' destination for recreation, music festivals, writers' festivals, centre for spirituality, and has a strong art's hub. Again, a greater sense of parish unity can develop from the Parish creating connecting points with this diverse community of locals and transients and using the significant buildings in new ways with creative ministries. Meditation, Taize worship, contemplative worship, book discussion groups, religious art shows, mini music festivals, will bring new life to the various, much loved buildings.


