Who is Jesus?

This week we reflect on the Transfiguration of Jesus. The setting as told in Luke is that the group of twelve had been called; there had been miracles; and there had been a profession of faith by Peter about Jesus being the Messiah they had waited for. Now in prayer on a mountain top, three of the twelve witness Jesus communing with God. If there was any doubt in their minds to that point about Jesus, the voice from the cloud should have dispelled them 'this is my son – do as you are told, be faithful in worship, be faithful in caring for each other'.

I recall gathering with colleagues years ago in my previous appointment, as we updated our Safe Ministry training. This training is designed to make the ministry we are each called to as safe as we possibly can for our young people and for all who come in contact with the Church. I was impressed by the quality of the presentations and particularly the opening presenter for the day who challenged us about the importance of what she called "wearing Jesus well". This was a reminder to be aware that the way we act, and the way we speak with one another, reflects not just what we are like, but what God is like, so we should be the best we can possibly be.

In Exodus 34 we read that Moses came down the mountain and God's people saw something of the reflected Glory of God in his face. A glory so great that Moses took to wearing a veil. Paul reminds us in his second letter to the Church in Corinth, that in Jesus the Christ the veil is removed. In Christ it is we who become the reflectors of God's glory for all people, a glory so great that it becomes first in our lives. We are then able to love others. Putting God first does not make our families and friends second best. Putting God first makes our families and our communities better than they could ever be any other way.

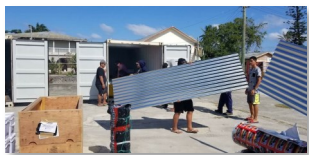

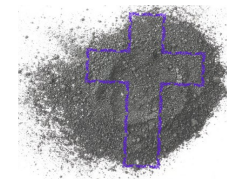
