From Grahame

When people find out I am a Christian Minister some will say something like, "I've started reading the Bible". I will often then ask, "what part are you reading?" to which the reply will very likely be "the beginning, I'm reading from the beginning".

The beginning seems a really good place to start to read a book. We call the Bible a book. Bible means book so we call the Bible 'The Book'. The trouble is a lot of people who start to read the Bible from the beginning don't persevere, they don't finish the book! They don't actually read the part that makes it all make sense. The Bible is more like a library of books. People even talk about the 'books of the Bible'. In the books of the Bible called the Gospels, you will find out about Jesus. You will find out about Jesus being born just like us; you will find out about Jesus' life in the world and the ministry of Jesus; you will find out about the amazing things that God has done in human history through Jesus.

One of the Gospels is called John. In John 14.6 Jesus says "I am the way and the truth and the life". This was very confronting to the people who first heard it. This statement by Jesus has been confronting people for over 2000 years. In it, Jesus places a challenge before each of us – live a different way, make a choice, make a choice to be reconciled to God through him and then live a life being God's love to others. Care for the people around you; care for God's creatures; care for the environment; be mindful of the results of your actions and take responsibility for them. We like to have things our own way. We like to do things our way. God has a better way. God's way is the way of Jesus.

When we start reading the Bible from the beginning, and particularly if we don't manage to read it all the way through, we can get a funny idea of what God is like and then try to fit Jesus into our funny idea. If we want to know what God is like we need look to Jesus. Jesus says in John 14.7 that if we know Jesus we know God.


