From Grahame

I remember last year in Gilgandra, the absolute joy of being able to gather for Palm Sunday, the beginning of the great week of the Christian year. That joy was heightened because the year before we had been locked down as a community due to CoVid-19. This year Brenda and I are again locked down due to that virus. We will miss the joy of being physically gathered in community on Palm Sunday even as we give thanks for the expressions of care and support, we have received. As a community, both our appreciation of the privilege of physically gathering and the way in which we care for those who can't, have been part of our learning through the continuing pandemic which I believe has aided our response in community to the recent floods and the continuing aftermath. In the midst of great challenge there remains great hope.

We begin our journey this week with shouts of hosanna! We will have the opportunity later in the week to share a meal. Then to contemplate afresh the confusion of sacrifice, which was good for us, on Good Friday. Always carrying within us the confident hope of resurrection. In the midst of great challenge there remains great hope.

As I reflect again on the scriptures which will guide us through this week, what jumps out from the page for me is the unrest in the community of that time. Insurrection, revolution was in the air. We can easily forget the atmosphere of the time and as we know, context is important. We are told that murder had been committed as part of the unrest and that Barabbas was part of the murderous group. Imagine the fear that this must have created. In contrast Jesus healed, brought life where there had been death and spoke of the glory of God, and the people in the end condemn him to death. The people call for Jesus to be crucified. The people were scared. In Jesus, they were being asked to exchange the stability of the Roman peace for something else – a peace which they did not know and could not understand – The peace of God which passes all understanding (Philippians 4.7).

Admittedly the stability of Roman governance came at a cost. The emperor's peace was enforced by violence; the emperor's

peace relied on the oppression, marginalisation, and persecution of many to provide comfort to a particular class of people, Roman Citizens, a citizenship which was not open to all, citizenship of a select group. But even the non-citizens, if they kept their head down, if they did as they were told, they could get by under the Roman peace, if they were lucky, they could live a kind of life. A life ruled by and lived in, fear.

Jesus came bringing a peace which passed all understanding. Jesus came offering a freedom which the people also struggled to understand. The disciples had been told by Jesus what would happen, but they still did not understand. As the predicted events unfold, the disciples act in interesting ways to deny the inevitable. It is left to others who respond with anointing for the next stage of Jesus' pilgrimage while from the inner most circle comes betrayal; the anointing for the burial to come, the anointing of the King of eternity, recognition from outside and betrayal from within.

Betrayal, hate and fear or forgiveness, love and peace. It continues to amaze me how our fear of the latter continues to lead us to the former. Our fear of the consequences of faith in God's forgiveness and love which brings God's peace, keeps us in the practices of betrayal and hate which fear brings.

As we make our pilgrimage with Christ this week, may we choose forgiveness over betrayal; love over hate, and find our rest in the peace of God, eternally.
