## From Grahame

Recently I have been having conversations about some aspects of our church buildings and why we do the things we do in the way we do them (ethnomethodology). A great deal of thought has gone into the layout of our places of worship so they may be aids to worship. For example, pulpits and altars are elevated for practical reasons, to enable people to see and hear the person preaching from the pulpit and presiding at the altar. In the architecture of many Anglican Churches, they are placed on the same level to remind us of the place in our faith of God's Holy Word and the sacrament of Holy Communion. In our contemporary gatherings the preacher often speaks from a lectern or other place, to create a sense of togetherness, of the Word being amongst the people of God. This is also consistent with the tradition of reading the gospel from among the congregation. These outward and visible signs are intended to assist God's people in worship. A tradition is not an end in itself. Traditions point to something more.

Another aspect of our worship is the church calendar. After the great celebration of Pentecost, wasn't it great to be all together in one place, we enter what the Church calls 'ordinary time'. Do not be confused, worship will be anything but ordinary. This will be a time of particular teaching focused on growth in our faith. The liturgical colour will be green to reflect this. There will be time to bless new ministries and give thanks to God for existing ones. We will reflect again on the journey of Jesus with us, hear of miraculous happenings and challenges.

In reflecting on the Gospel according to Luke this week we hear again of Jesus bringing peace to someone who had lived in torment for a long time. Some may focus on the power of Jesus over demons, some may focus on the fear of the people, and some may be concerned for the loss of livelihood of the pigs. I hope some, a growing number, may recognise the purpose of miracles as signposts pointing to
