From Grahame

Our passage from the Acts of the Apostles this week begins "When the day of Pentecost had come, they were all together in one place." This Sunday we have the opportunity to gather together in one place as a parish community. It is two years since the Parish of Byron was formed by amalgamating the parishes of Bangalow, Mullumbimby, and Byron Bay. This amalgamation has provided resources and opportunities for ministry which would not have been possible otherwise.

The greatest opportunity has been the enrichment of relationships across the new parish, gathering with neighbours to form new relationships and deepening existing ones. As we gather as one, we may be encouraged in our pilgrimage to live our lives of faith in our distinct communities while enjoying the freedom to move between our various centres and diverse forms of worship. As we have been praying for Christian unity, we should remember unity is not sameness. Unity is a recognition that the whole is made greater than the sum of its parts in diversity.

In my previous appointment, one of the worship centres for which I had responsibility was a rural locality on the Western Plains near the Queensland boarder. Church there was a little different. Once a month after 9 am worship in the nearby town where we lived, we would drive 100 kilometres north on the black soil tracks where the faithful would gather under the tennis shelter next to the school. Everyone was welcome for Church, lunch, and some tennis if you were so inclined. One of the members of this community congregation was Len. On one of our first visits, I found myself on the tennis court with my supervisor as a tennis partner facing Len and his older partner across the net. After they wiped the court with us my offsider and I headed for the shade. The wife of my companion told us not to forget to wish Len happy birthday, he turned 76 that day. My tennis partner and I could not count 76 years between us. That was 20 years ago.
