From Grahame

Every day we are challenged, challenged to take a different path to the one we are called by God to follow. Every day we are tempted to exclude some to make others more comfortable or to accumulate more while leaving others with so little. We should never forget Jesus chose inclusiveness over exclusiveness; authenticity over mere observance and every day we should give thanks he chose sacrifice over self-interest. Where Jesus saw a need he met that need with compassion and love and grace, and encouraged others to do the same.

In C.S. Lewis's Screwtape Letters, the workers on the side of the other guy in this battleground we call 'the world', are said to exchange letters. One of the letters between a worker high up in the chain to a lesser demon suggests not to worry too much about the prayers of immature Christians, just keep them a bit muddled, encourage them to pray about what everyone else is doing to them so that they don't think too much about what they may be doing to others.

Every time we allow our annoyance to take control of the way we offer compassion, the enemy wins. Every time we allow our prejudices to take control of the way we offer the love of God, the enemy wins. Every time we allow our desires to blind us to the fullness of God's grace, the enemy wins. Receiving the salvation which Jesus the Christ makes possible is not the end of our story. It is the means by which we are enabled to complete our pilgrimage in the service of our risen and ascended Saviour. Pray about that. Pray for yourself and your friends. But more importantly, pray for your enemies and those who persecute you. Don't pray they may be nicer to you, pray you and they may be more focused on, and open to, God. The rest will flow from that. Christians have a gospel to proclaim. It is God's good news for everyone.
