From Grahame

In worship last week, Jesus spoke to us of his coming among God's people causing division. This week Jesus is causing indignation. Some translations say "the ruler of the synagogue was irritated". Have you ever been sitting in church communing with God and then something irritates you? You may be able to empathise with the synagogue ruler. He was probably an overworked and over paid official in the synagogue who was pestered all week long by people wanting advice and healing, and prayers, and maybe a short term loan. Now this guy breezes in and starts healing people on the only day when he could count on everyone just sitting and communing with God, and maybe unrolling a scroll or two. You can empathise surely?

Was the ruler really irritated by healing on the Sabbath? Or was he irritated that this upstart, this blow-in, was once again stealing centre-stage?

The very serious question behind the irritation, and by extension the question which we need to satisfy for ourselves is – Is this of God or of the other guy? Some were just happy to be healed. Some just wanted to see the establishment get a rough deal for a change. Most were confused. Is this Jesus of God? Or of the other guy? If I trust him, if I believe in him, will I be saved, or will I be damned?

How those around Jesus answer this question, how we answer this question today is what caused and continues to cause division. I attend gatherings in the wider Church and continue to hear teaching which has a thread bullying through it – do it my way or this will happen, do it the way I say, or you will burn! It saddens me when I hear this teaching. It saddens me for many reasons. One reason is because it means when I travel into the isolated parts of our land I will continue to see three people going into one church building, and four going into another, I will see dozens of people in a coffee shop instead of going to worship, because 'if they can't sort themselves out at least we can get a decent cup of coffee and check our phones'.

In the town Brenda and I moved from to be here, there were nine Church groups participating in our ministry association – we called the group The Combined Christian Churches. As part of that group I had faith that if someone wandered into any of

I was able to say that one of the reasons we had many church buildings was because we could not all fit in one. There are enough things which are used as excuses to divide our communities. Let's not make the faith we share be one of them. If this Jesus is of God, if we agree in this let us build on that foundation.
