From Grahame

This week we come to the end of the Church year in the great festival of Christ the King. The selection of readings today brings to fulfilment the primacy of Jesus as king and the ultimate rebuttal of all who suggest that God's love can ever be defeated by the petty musings of would be philosophers and pretenders. Strong words perhaps? But this is too important to allow for any mistake. God's love conquers all!

In Paul's letter he describes the Church in Colossae in a similar situation to the ones I have been describing recently. Some believed they knew better. Some believed they had special knowledge which transcended the absolute supremacy of God's reconciling and all embracing love in Christ Jesus. Some suggested that Jesus was not wholly divine. Paul gently but firmly refutes this. Remember, it is not the case that if we study really hard, God will reach out to us. It is not the case that if we stand sit or kneel in a certain way God will love us. It is not even the case that if we do certain things God will love us more because God could not love us any more than the moment we were formed – even before then. In this we find the courage and strength to face our daily challenges. In this we find the grace to share kindness and love with those we meet.

Christ the King Sunday 20 November 2022

Jeremiah 23.1-6; *A Song of Zechariah* (APBA pp 10, 425) *or* Psalm 46; Colossians 1.11-20; Luke 23.33-43
