#### From Grahame

Just over 7 years ago, I had the privilege of travelling as part of the Cooee March 2015 Re-enactment, which marched from Gilgandra to Sydney. The motivation for the march was to honour the commitment of those who marched in 1915, responding to a call for help. The Cooee March was the first and largest of the World War 1 recruitment marches. By October of 1915 the marchers had heard reports from the warfront and had some understanding of what was being asked of them. Yet still they offered to help.

During the 26 days of the re-enactment march, we had many opportunities to reflect on those who had gone before us. We shared something of the love of the communities they passed through and something of the pain of the track. We shared new friendships and, since our return, have shared the heartache of farewelling some of our number. I am sure the re-enactment march meant many different things to each of us. For me it was one of the most physically and psychologically challenging things I have ever experienced and I would not have been able to do what I did without the support of the community which sent us out, and the community which formed on the track. Each day there were challenges but there was also encouragement and mutual support as we faced our personal and corporate trials and tribulations as community. I also had the confidence and reassurance that I was where God wanted me to be at that time.

As we make our final preparations for Christmas my prayer is that we may remember something of those who have gone before us, something of their sacrifice and commitment which has provided us with the opportunities of community, and may we take a moment to give thanks for the blessings we have received. There are many places throughout the world where it would not have been possible to gather and pray in public parks as hundreds did during the re-enactment march and in their thousands in Martin Place,



# The Fourth Sunday of Advent - Sunday 18 Dec 2022

Isaiah 7.10-16; Psalm 80.1-7, 17-19; Romans 1.1-7; Matthew 1.18-25

They shall name him Emmanuel, which means, 'God is with us'.
