From Grahame

This week we reflect again on the section of the Gospel according to Matthew commonly referred to as the 'Beatitudes'. A Beatitude is a blessing. Before Jesus gathered the crowd on the mountainside, the usage of a Beatitude was to describe the benefit one might receive from a particular accomplishment or form of behaviour, either in the present or in a future time. The way Jesus uses this form, as we would expect, is something different.

In the Beatitudes Jesus gives us a description of the types of people we might find if we look at an average community, God's people. In Jesus' use of the Beatitudes, every traditional measure of success is turned upside down. The Good News is then particularly good news for those this world would discard. Imagine the stories told following the Sermon on the Mount about what this Good News would mean for the poor, the hungry, for those who mourn.... What stories could we tell today about what the Good News has meant for us?

As we reflect in our gathering together, we hear retold how people gathered around Jesus, drawn by the authority of his message, and what a message. We may sometimes become shy or nervous about sharing this message because we may not think people will want to hear what we have to say. But we must remember it is not our message, it is God's message. It is God's message which people want to hear and should not be watered down.

We see all around us a growing culture of the pursuit of happiness. I want to challenge us about happiness. In our modern pursuit of the easy life it would be **easy** to reinterpret the message Jesus brings as 'follow me and I will make you happy'. It would be **easy** to replace 'blessed' with happy, which would give us the imperative to avoid being unhappy. But the opposite of being blessed is actually to be cursed. Don't make the mistake of turning the Good News into a promise of sugar drops with the alternative being to not have sugar drops. The Good News is the blessing of God through Jesus Christ with an alternative too terrible to contemplate.

I immediately asked if anything good had ever happened to her friend and moved from there to seeing the good which had come from some of the things she had listed as bad. It is in our nature to see the bad in everything and everyone, but that is the 'wisdom' of this world. We are called instead to look for the Christ in everyone and proclaim God's message he brings. We find him with the poor and the meek, with the Jews and the Gentiles and we find him nailed to a tree. But that's not the end of the story.

Micah 6.1-8; Psalm 15; 1 Corinthians 1.18-31; Matthew 5.1-12

In his 'sermon on the mount' Jesus tells us about the kinds of people who will be blessed by God: the poor in spirit, those who mourn, the meek, those who hunger and thirst for righteousness, the merciful, the pure in heart, the peacemakers, the persecuted, the reviled. We can see that none of these are what would normally be thought of as successful people. God's values do not align with worldly attainment. Those who will be blessed by God have already been dismissed by the world as being irrelevant failures, yet God's heart treasures them. How can we renounce things like status, power, and worldly wealth for those things that God finds value in?

Lord Jesus Christ, may I always value what you value, eschewing those things of no ultimate significance. Give thanks for the work and witness of the Church of the Province of Myanmar.
