

From Grahame

Christians get labels. Labels like being holier than thou and too good to mix with regular people.... You may be able to think of some others. In the passage of Matthew this week, Jesus responds to those who try to say he is lowering standards and ignoring the law. Jesus is not lowering standards. Jesus is raising them. This is one of my favourite passages because it reminds us Christians are regular people and Jesus wants to save Christians too. We cannot do it alone, we need Jesus.

I have told some of you the story of a town in which my family lived where it seemed the park would have a visiting Christian revival group every weekend. It was a rite of passage for some coastal congregations to have an outback experience and save some souls in the bush. On a particular weekend I was in the park for the mandatory revival meeting and enjoying the singing when the preacher for the day got up and started 'as a former sinner'. Oh dear! What so now he is perfect, he no longer makes mistakes, now he doesn't need Jesus.

Now we get into some hard work. Jesus says, not only don't murder, but don't be angry; not only don't commit adultery but don't even think about it. How does that fit with those saying look but don't touch and you are alright? Not only do not swear or in other words do not lie, but don't think that by invoking the name of your dear mum or your children or God, that you make your idea of the truth any more truthful. Just say yes or no. How refreshing would that be, how simple a life we could live if all we had was yes or no.

Can you imagine the outrage of the people Jesus first spoke to? Can you imagine the fear? What do we do about this? Do we pretend we didn't hear? Or do we just shrug and say 'that Jesus said some really messed up stuff'?

What I think the preacher of my story meant to say as he got up to speak was 'as a forgiven sinner'. Through the forgiveness of God in Jesus Christ we are forgiven, not just once but every day and every hour and minute of every day. One of the reasons Christians get bad press is that people think, that we think we are better than everyone else. They probably got this idea
