

From Grahame

Last week we reflected on the beatitudes, blessings from God. When people look at a Christian community such as ours, it is our hope they will see something of God's blessings at work in the world. Today we hear Jesus encourage us to live into the reality of these blessings, to be a help to others as they discern God's will; to not hide the light of Christ under a bowl or a bushel basket.

Jesus told the first disciples they were the salt of the earth and the light of the world. Salt and light are two basic elements, basic elements with a purpose, a mission. The mission of salt in the world is to be salty. To preserve and to enhance what is already present. Salt is also used to heal. The mission of light in the world is to reveal things that would otherwise be hidden; to show the path, to illuminate our endeavours. If salt and light are separated from their mission they are no longer really salt or light. The disciples then are to be one with their mission. They should no longer consider themselves as holding an identity separated from their mission.

Jesus did not say 'and therefore you are all going to be working 24 hour days'. This is not about working harder. It is about **being** more than doing and **being** complete. Witnessing to the truth of the Gospel is not a job, it is a way of life. Jesus did not give the first group a new job. Jesus called them into a new being, or more accurately, he called them into an expression of the being God had created in the first place. Where we get into trouble is when we try to put on our faith like a coat for particular events or situations and then take it off again. Jesus is telling the disciples that in responding and following him they are already salt and light to the world, now **be**.

The author, Phillip Yancey touched on this concept when reflecting in his book 'Just Wondering' on what made the Saints different. He suggests that what separated the Saints from others is that while your average person is concerned with trying to please many people, the Saints more fully lived



Isaiah 58.1-9a, [9b-12]; Psalm 112; 1 Corinthians 2.1-13, [14-16]; Matthew 5.13-20
