From Grahame

This week as we reflect on the good news, Jesus explains to the Apostles that they are valued. They are known and valued as individuals for the unique gifts they bring to the community. Then, after reflecting on living together in unity with each other and with God, Jesus speaks of division. When we hear of philosophies or concepts or ideas, the discussion may not deeply touch us. These debates can be something which happens separate from us. Jesus was a real person (and more). When a person asks you directly, 'are you with me or against me' there needs to be a response. It becomes something personal. To take up your cross and follow Jesus requires a personal decision. At that time, when the audience was predominantly of the Jewish faith, don't forget that Jesus was a good Jewish boy, to follow Jesus often meant to be in disagreement with one's own family.

To be identified as Christian was to be set apart as a target in a world that did not agree with what you were doing. That is why it was so important to have times of regathering and rekindling. Is any of this sounding familiar? This is the world in which we live. We live in a time when we are told it is not cool to be Christian. We are living through the same types of challenges the Apostles faced. I remember many years ago introducing a group of young people to the concept of 'random acts of kindness' the things we do for others without thought of personal reward. This concept is different to what our young people are bombarded with each day. Surely this idea of giving without expecting anything in return should be one of the characteristics of our Christian community? In speaking with the group back then, we discussed how a 'random act of kindness' could be as simple as listening to someone who is having a tough time. Is this the community of faith we want to invite people into?

What are we inviting people to come into, what are we inviting them to become? I suggest that we want people to come and encounter Jesus. We want them to feel what it is like to be loved unconditionally, to experience random acts of kindness,

Ordinary Sunday 12 A {Pentecost 4} Sunday 25 June 2023

Genesis 2.18-21; Psalm 86.1-10, 16-17; Romans 6.1-11; Matthew 10.24-29

In Romans, Paul presents the gospel that we enter into a right relationship with God only by the grace of God, which is a free gift. We receive this gift by putting our faith in the death and resurrection of Jesus. And only by faith: there is nothing else we ourselves can do to earn being put right with God. But for Paul's interlocutors, if a right relationship with God is ours for free, then we can keep on doing bad things because we will always be forgiven anyway. In fact, the more bad things we do the more grace there will be. Grace has no ethic. Paul's answer is that in our baptism, we were baptized into Christ's death which put to death our old life of doing bad things. And gave us new life which enables us to do good. Grace does have an ethic.
