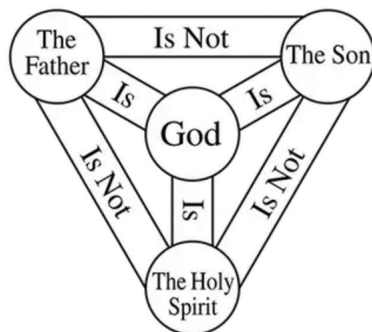

From Grahame

This week we are reflecting on the Holy Trinity. The doctrine of the Trinity has long been difficult for many to understand and even more difficult to explain. Preachers often wince as they struggle to explain the concept of God as three-in-one. Words like "triune" find their way into liturgies and prayers, although they are seldom – if ever – used outside the Christian church. This diagram or a variation is often used to try to understand the Trinity.



It is no small wonder then, that many people prefer to leave the concept of the Trinity as a holy mystery, and have moved away from trying to explain or understand it. Many Christian churches use this day to move beyond a formula of the Trinity and celebrate the myriad Biblical images of God. I would like to suggest the Trinity as the ultimate expression of justice, equality and unity. As with these concepts in our communities, we may only ever begin to approach an understanding of God as three and one. As we seek equality and unity with our sisters and brothers through just structures in community, our life experience which forms our world view, prevents us from fully comprehending the other. Our temptation is to try to only understand and support those aspects of the other which are like ourselves. This becomes an obstacle to the justice, equality and unity we seek. As we respond to each other, may all our interactions model God's grace and love.

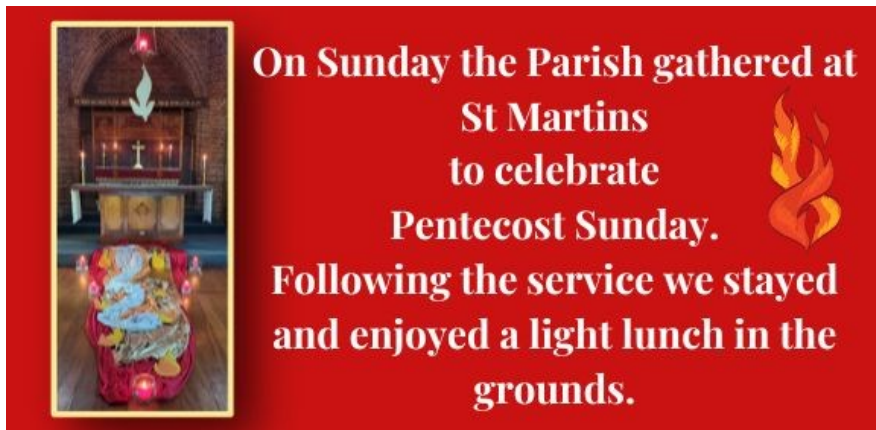
