#### From Grahame

Power and influence. Jesus had great power. Jesus performed miracles. Jesus raised the dead to life. Jesus can do anything. But the thing which most endures in those who follow him, his greatest impact was and is, through his influence in the lives of those he met; people who were transformed by their encounter and passed their experience on to others in the way they lived their lives of faith. In this way countless millions have come to know the love of God in Christ Jesus. This is discipleship. In 1 Thessalonians chapter 2, Paul gives us a description of discipleship – encouraging, comforting, urging.

In our passage from Matthew chapter 22, those considered keepers of the law try to trap Jesus again. Jesus responds with a very short statement which is all about love. This is the foundation of discipleship. Yet it did not seem like love to those who found the teaching from Jesus to be a threat to their power bases. It was and remains a love of liberation for those who receive it and are open to its influence.

We face those same challenges today as some attempt to contain and control a love which can be neither contained nor controlled by human powers. This is the greatest miracle, all else points to this one fact – God is love.

All through this day dear Lord, let me touch as many lives as possible for you, and every life I touch please bless by your Holy Spirit, whether through the words I speak, the prayer I breathe or the life I live; so shall your kingdom come on earth as in heaven. Amen.
