

From Grahame

Do we have a contradiction this week, as we reflect on the 10 Commandments and yet hear that the way of the law is death? This is a similar conundrum to the two commandments. How may I love God more than my wife who is the love of my life? Isn't that being less than faithful to my wife? As we grow in faith we realise it is by loving God first that I am able to love my wife in the way she deserves to be loved.

Paul reminds us we have tried life by the law and it didn't work for us. It is only through God's supreme act of love in Jesus the Christ, and in and by the power of the Holy Spirit that we may complete the task before us. Life in the Spirit is not part of an either/or situation. Life in the Spirit is the way we meet the Commandments of God with anything other than failure. God gives us the victory through Christ!

It would be easy, and has been done often, to see Paul's warning to the Church in Philippi as yet another reason to be careful about who are let into the fellowship of the Church. Nothing could be further from the truth or Paul's intention.

Paul warns against dogs and evil workers. These were terms the community had heard often from the mouths of their religious leadership. It was the way they described those outside the Jewish faith, the Gentiles, each of us. It was a description used to exclude some from the love of God by defining them as the 'other'. There was an attempt to bring this attitude into the early Church, to bring in a rule that all new believers must first be accepted as followers of the Law, before they could be accepted as followers of Jesus, to go through the law before they could live by faith. Doesn't really make sense when you say it aloud does it? Life by faith is the only way we may meet the Law of God and survive.
