This week as we continue through the season of Lent, Jesus speaks of the cross we may bear in his name. What are we meant to take up and what is it we should be putting down?

In the Anglican tradition, before a minister is ordained they go on retreat. On my retreat in preparation for being made a deacon, I remember being troubled. The retreat leader led us in some short talks to guide our reflection and offered certain times for private discussion. He also offered the lesser sacrament of reconciliation of the penitent, better known as confession.

This is not part of the tradition I grew up in so I was not sure. As I prayed I identified that the thing causing my discomfort was a bad attitude I carried toward a previous clergy supervisor. I was carrying a spirit of unforgiveness toward this person and it was weighing me down. 'But you don't understand what he did to me.....' I am sure we are all familiar with situations similar to this and the response we use which keeps us bound to the person or situation. The next day I made my confession to God through the retreat leader and I was set free. I was able to submit to being ordained and here we are.

I don't need to work with the that person any more but I continue to pray for them. I have been able to provide them with pastoral support in their own challenges and smile when I visit with them at their home, as they come to terms with the next phase of their journey with God.

Forgiveness can be transformative for the person being forgiven but even more for the one able to offer it through Jesus Christ. When we forgive those hardest to forgive, we are acting most fully as God's instrument and through this we are closer to God. Who wouldn't want to smile about that?
