

From Grahame

What is driving you away from Jesus? What is preventing you from living into the life God has called you to live? What is it that draws you to Jesus? What is encouraging you in your faith journey?

This week the context of our gospel passage is pre-crucifixion. We have gone back to listen to Jesus again for advice about our lives of faith in a post resurrection world. Jesus identifies himself as the Good Shepherd and describes a rather extreme understanding of the role of a shepherd in laying down his life for the sheep. We are part of that flock. How does it feel? How does it feel to know that the Good Shepherd has laid down his life for you and for me? Is that part of what is driving you away from Jesus or is it drawing you into a deeper relationship with God through him? How does it feel to know that Jesus knows you and calls you by name?

In the time the gospel was written it was likely that when the sheep were penned up there would be more than one shepherd's flock in an enclosure, and this worked because each shepherd knew their sheep and the sheep knew their shepherd. The shepherd knew their sheep so well they could have almost named them. The leaders of that time, even in the face of all the evidence they themselves had gathered in regard to Jesus, did not know him. They did not know their own sheep and they failed to recognise the Good Shepherd when he arrived.

In this week's 'I am' statement, Jesus is confronting the onlookers, forcing them to make a decision about who Jesus is for them. Who is Jesus to us? Who is it that we are looking for? What wolf is trying to scatter you and drive you away from the love of God in Jesus the Christ? These wolves may not look like wolves. They may not have masses of hair and sharp pointy teeth. The wolves that would drive us away are more subtle and they are rarely the things we expect. They are things like spending more time on possessions then on people; going along with the crowd when your heart is telling you it is wrong; being more con-

Jesus knows his sheep and call's them by name, they listen and follow him. Jesus does not just call us once. Jesus is continually calling us into relationship with God through him.
