To be a Christian Presence in the Community, Living by Faith, Known by Love, Sharing a Voice of Hope.

We are blessed with many resources. Our challenge is always how to best contribute to the mission of the Church in this place, consistent with our Mission Statement.

In my appointment prior to Byron, this time of prayer for Christian unity would have been the completion of a week of combined worship in various locations of the 8 Churches of the town, and the privilege of hosting the final gathering of the week. As we face new challenges as community, it is important to remember that we are not alone.

In my reading I have been reflecting on Paul's letter to the Galatians and have come to one of the most encouraging parts of his writing. You see, one of the things that was happening in the background of the Galatian church was that old problem. Who is worthy to be part of the 'in' crowd and who is out, and should we let those that are out in? If we let some in what will they need to do to be classed as in, what hoops will they need to jump through, because you couldn't just let people that had previously been out, in, unless they had paid some kind of fee, or price, or passed a test or something, surely? Who paid the fee, who paid the price, who passed the test? One of the reasons some like to have symbols in church buildings is to remind us of who paid the price.

The Galatians had fallen into that old trap. When we arrive at a new destination or complete a task we will often have an opinion about those that have yet to complete the journey or complete the task. Some may see the challenges they have overcome as a foundation to help others have an

easier journey, others may take the view that if they had to go through x,y or z, to get to where they have, then why shouldn't everyone else? That is essentially the argument that Paul was having with the established Church, because the organisation had begun to develop obstacles to God's grace. The Church members had forgotten whom it was who paid the price of their admission. Paul realised that some were trying to rewrite history so he wrote to the Church. In Galatians 3.28 he reminds the Church that obstacles of heritage, status and gender have been removed because we are all one in Christ Jesus. Jesus gave himself to fund God's great rescue mission for God's people. Paul reminds us the rescue happens now, the life boat is alongside the hands are stretched out to save us, really all that is left for us to do is stop fighting; stop hanging on to those things which are dragging us under; kick off our wet and soggy boots of fear and anger because we don't need them anymore; leave behind the lifejacket of possessions; switch off the beacon of our prejudices which maintain us in misunderstanding and bitterness and accept the lifeboat of God's love.

All through this day dear Lord, let me touch as many lives as possible for you, and every life I touch please bless by your Holy Spirit, whether through the words I speak, the prayer I breathe or the life I live; so shall your kingdom come on earth as in heaven. Amen.
