From Grahame

I think we can assume most Christians consider themselves to be compassionate. It seems to go with the label. The same with being generous, it's assumed. But we do have limits, for our own self-care we set boundaries. It is a reality that our boundaries may be influenced by our prejudices, our preconceived ideas.

We all have that person or situation, even if we don't acknowledge it, we believe unworthy or beyond our compassion, beyond our generosity. Fortunately for us, the compassion and generosity of God is not like that. Fortunately for us, the compassion and generosity of God is boundless. This week in our Gospel reading the one considered worthy and the one ostracised are united in their worthiness before God. An unnamed woman in the crowd and a leader of the synagogue are united in their desire for healing and both receive healing. In the case of the daughter of Jairus, Jesus did something different to what was expected. Perhaps they thought he was a traditional healer so when the young girl had died they believed all hope was gone. Jesus brought hope and life when everyone else believed there was none. He instructed the family to give food to prove this was no ghost. He would use this same example following his own resurrection. Jesus' touch brought new life where others saw only death. Jesus heals the social outcast and the leader's daughter in the same way, with the same healing grace. Not different grades of grace for different classes, but the same grace available to all who call upon his name.

When we reflect on stories of healing there is a personal dimension. If we dig down deep enough, if we are honest enough, the question we are seeking an answer to is "will I be healed", "will the ones I love be healed?" Part of our reality is that we see some healed while others are not. At times like this it may be helpful to reflect on what we believe it means to be healed.

Some of the benefits of being part of a worldwide church and particularly at the moment through technology, is our opportunity to be connected so that we do not become an inwards looking sect. We are able to share the experiences of people from both the same and diverse expressions of our faith. I know a person on the other side of the country,

Painting and scaffolding quotes for the Vicarage at Bangalow have been received. There are associated matters around the Vicarage to attend to before the actual painting.

A Memorandum of Understanding between Anglicare North Coast, the Anglican Parish of Byron and The Buttery has been received. It is an agreement required in order to progress the transitional housing project at the Bangalow site.
