The Reflectionary

From Grahame

Over the past weeks Jesus has been speaking to us through our Sunday readings, of the close relationship God wants to share with us. A closeness, in relationship terms, as close as the food we eat is to our bodies, absorbed by a body and fueling everything our bodies do. Jesus says his flesh and blood has become the fuel for our reconciled relationship with God – for ever. You may not remember, but the lead up to that statement was the miracle of the multiplication of the loaves, which came about after Jesus and the 12 had left home because of the crowds who formed as Jesus and the disciples tried to catch up with each other about what had been happening. Today we are back at a meal, another opportunity to catch up on all that had happened and refuel for the next adventure.

The local Pharisees had been joined by the big guns, scribes from Jerusalem, who came looking to find fault. They attempt to discredit Jesus according to the Law. But Jesus knows the Law far better. It is not the Law which is in question but the interpretation of the Law which had been twisted to keep some in power while others were pushed aside.

Some of the concepts we read of in the Holy Scriptures each week are so alien to the lives we see lived out each day that it would be easy to ignore them, and we often do. The Pharisees and the scribes had become so inward looking that they failed to see the truth right in front of them. They had developed activities, rules and interpretations which made it impossible for the average person to be included. They had become obstacles between God's people and God. In response to this exclusiveness Jesus proclaims God's love. James Chapter 1, describes acts of love for one another as the perfect law. If we follow God's perfect law of love then even our self-serving base instincts may be turned to the good. We live in times when we are encouraged to focus on ourselves and do the best for ourselves at the expense of others. This is at best short sighted because the joy we find in this self-promotion culture is short sighted and short lived. In accepting into ourselves, and following, the perfect law of God's love we may
