From Grahame

Week by week we have heard again of the mounting pressures placed on Jesus. Jesus had been having a very busy time and each time he attempted to find some peace and quiet, the crowds would find him. This week we hear of Jesus heading toward the coast for a time-out. Jesus had been ministering in rural communities and market towns, among primary producers, family enterprises and also those who had fallen through the cracks of community. Now he travels to an export community on the coast. Perhaps in this foreign land, as a stranger, he can lose himself in the crowds as just a regular person for a while. It was not to be.

Once we accept God's call on our lives, our lives are never the same again. There is no time-out from God. We do need time-out from our everyday pressures. We do need times of rest and renewal. From the very beginning of God's Holy Word we are set an example by God of times of activity and times of rest each week. But it can be hard. The temptation to be indispensable, like all the temptations of this world, is strong and superficially attractive, and like the temptations of this world the 'need to be needed' is inwardly destructive.

As we navigate the demands of 24/7 society it is ever more imperative for us to take our Sabbath rest. This does not need to be on a Sunday, but it does need to happen regularly. One of the corruptions of some interpretations of Scripture was the idea that if I go to Church on Sunday, God's Day, I have fulfilled my commitment to God and I'll have the other six days for myself, thank you very much. This led to the attitude of having a part of our lives with God when we put on our best clothes and our best outward appearance and do God type things, and then the rest of the time we would do what? Ungodly things?
