

From Grahame

This week, our readings bring into focus our perception of God's presence and absence. Job is tempted to believe God to be absent at his most challenging times. The man questioning Jesus in Mark 10.17 is confronted by how God's presence impacts the way he had chosen to live his life. In the end the man, who had so much, rejected God's way and turned his back on Jesus; he turned his back on the one thing he needed before all else. This was a time very much like today. There were plenty of people who would tell you what you needed to do to have a better life. Today our media is full of people telling us their product will give us a better life. Our telephones buzz uninvited with people telling us we need their product to have a better life, and they can get quite annoyed if we don't agree with them.

The rich man of our gospel passage thought Jesus could provide easy answers to his problems, perhaps he thought Jesus would provide a way of getting around God. Jesus immediately brought focus back to God as the giver of all good things. After some preliminary questioning, Jesus invites the man into the circle of disciples. This is too much for the man, who was probably really just trying to pass the time until the market opened so that he could get some more new things. The man turned away.

God calls us into a discipleship which is sacrificial. It involves offering sacrificial hospitality to others.

The disciples were a little exasperated by Jesus' suggestion that more must be given. They believed they had done enough. I was like that. I was born at Dunedoo Hospital, baptised at the Anglican Church in Wellington, confirmed, and married in the Anglican Church, we had our children baptised and confirmed in the Anglican Church at the accepted times. I thought I was doing enough. I could see others doing more but I was okay, I was doing enough, until one day my Job experiences began. All these things seemed to happen to me and to my family for no good reason. How could God let these things happen? I was like the rich man who had done what


