

From Grahame

Pray without ceasing. Remain strong in the faith.

We have been journeying with Job who did not understand why he suffered. But through his encounter with God he is transformed and able to move forward. In our gospel passage this week, blind Bartimaeus recognised Jesus' place in history. It is Bartimaeus who publicly acknowledges Jesus as Son of David and receives the final act of healing prior to the ultimate healing of the cross. He sees God as the Messiah even through his blindness and follows. Sometimes being faithful can be challenging. Job persevered in prayer and faith and God was faithful. From this we should be encouraged not to give up on praver because victory over those things which challenge us will only be achieved when we have victory through prayer. I was chatting with a mature Christian the other night as he reflected that perhaps we should be content to pray our petitions to God just once and leave it at that, because God doesn't need to be reminded. Of course, God doesn't need to be reminded, but we do. In our prayers to God we have an opportunity to be reminded how faithful God is. Only when we acknowledge God in our lives and most especially through our prayer lives, may we fully appreciate the fruits of our endeavours that are made possible through the love of God in Jesus the Christ.

Through prayer we have an opportunity to clarify our hopes and our intentions, and to align those with what God has in store for us. Prayer helps us to remember what is important and to guide our actions. Prayer helps us to live more fully.
