

# Ordinary Sunday 33 B Sunday 17 November 2024

1 Samuel 1.4-20; The *Song of Hannah* (APBA p. 429); Hebrews 10.11-14 [15-18] 19-25; Mark 13.1-11

Today's gospel was written in the context of the persecution Christians were already beginning to experience. The words are to encourage them (as well as us) in times of trial, rather than point to a timetable for God's actions in the world. Whenever we challenge injustice or speak against the powers of oppression, then the powers will fight back, but we can trust that the Holy Spirit will give us the words we need.

Pray for Christians round the world who face persecution because of their stand for justice.

Give thanks for the work and witness of the Amity Foundation, created in 1985 on the initiative of Christians in China with the late Bishop K H Ting as its founder. Its main objective has been to help develop poor areas of the country.
