From Grahame

Last week we ended the Church year with the great celebration of Christ the King. This week begins a new year. During this year we will particularly focus on the Gospel according to Luke. The same author is credited with writing this gospel account and the Acts of the Apostles, so a significant part of the New Testament. Luke speaks to us in a series of short accounts, short stories if you like.

The context for the gospel passage this week is that people had been commenting on the beauty of the temple, and how they believed it would last. Jesus seeks to bring focus back to what is truly eternal, our relationship with God. We know the temple they were praising would be destroyed, so it is with all temporal things, worldly things, it is no accident that our word, temporary comes from this. Jesus challenges us to invest in what is eternal. We are constantly tempted to invest in temporary things, our possessions, while Jesus constantly reminds us to focus on relationships.

At the moment, Anglicans throughout Australia are being encouraged to be active in resisting gender-based violence. We know the statistics, we know the headlines reporting tragedy after tragedy, we know what Jesus would have us do. Through the gift of the Common Grace organisation we have this prayer from Reverend Tracy Lauersen which speaks far better than I could:

Let us pray,

Creator God, as Christians we know how far human relationships and intimate relationships fall short of the ideal for which we were created.

We are all created in Your image. The disrespect of one's partner through coercive control and its power tactics is a tragic and sinful rejection of one's whom you love. It is a denial of their inherent value as Your image bearers. It is a self-gratifying power play.




