

Reflectionary

A Christian presence in the community, living by faith, known by love, sharing a voice of hope.

From Grahame

This week our focus passage is found in Luke 4. Throughout Luke's writings there is an emphasis on Jesus' ministry to the marginalised in society, those kept from relationship with God through one excuse or another. Jesus' revelation that he is the proclamation of the Lord's favour; he is the Jubilee year, removes these excuses so all may know reconciliation with God and with each other, knowing the peace which only God may give.

What does this mean for us? There is no point saying "the Church has become cut off from the people", "the Church should do more", "who does the Church think they are anyway?" Because you know what is coming next, don't you? The church is each one of us. So, if you want to know why the church is not doing this or that, ask yourself.

During Advent I challenged us to reflect on what God was teaching us about ourselves by the way others annoy us. Now I ask, what is God calling us to do and be through those things which have been drawn to our attention, those things yet undone? I believe the overarching concept is one I have spoken about before, are we here to help or are we part of the problem? Are we a people who help remove obstacles or do we prefer to put them up?

How can we make a difference? Visit that person you have been putting off visiting, make a phone call, even just make a choice not to be drawn into a negative attitude or perspective and see the world transformed by our behaviour, one action and attitude at a time. If we seek to stand with Jesus, we had best be a people seeking to learn how to be removers of obstacles. Do you think we could set a time when we might start doing this? Today! This is the day of the Lord's favour.

Funeral


