From Grahame

This week our focus passage from John 12 describes a special gathering held in honour of Jesus in Bethany. The guest of honour is there, Mary and Martha are there, Lazarus is there, the disciples including Judas are there. There is tension in the room. Judas had been stealing, Martha had been baking and Mary sat at the feet of Jesus. Then Mary let down her hair – you can hear the intake of breath – outrageous, does this girl have no shame; Mary pours perfumed oil over the feet of Jesus and wipes his feet with her hair. Talk about awkward moments. Even by today's standards this would be an outrageous act. It may be impossible for us to comprehend such an act of pure love and devotion to God made flesh.

Judas breaks the spell. Thinking he is on safe ground, he puts the appeal of the poor. In hearing the response of Jesus those gathered must have thought they misheard. What would you have done? Who are you in that gathering? Are you Martha baking, baking, food will make things better, hospitality will hold us together? Can you empathise with Judas, juggling the conflicting commitments of providing for the group and still managing to give something to the poor out of an unstable income? What went wrong in all that for Judas? Could you have shown the extravagant love Mary did? Abandoning everything for God? Are you part of the silent majority waiting to see what happens next? Maybe hoping for another dust-up, maybe hoping everyone will just calm down and get on with each other? What are we to make of the suggestion about the poor?

Is this back to a two commandments issue? Is there anything which is not? Is Jesus telling us it is through our devotion to him the needs of the poor will be met? Love God first, then love each other, show this love by sharing resources. God has provided for all, that's not the issue. What does the realisation of this mean for you?
