From Grahame

Do we live as if God exists? Do we live as if Jesus died for us? Or do we live like this is all there is and so we had best get our fair share?

In our focus passage from Luke 12 this week, a voice from the crowd seeks what he believes is his fair share of the family's wealth. Deuteronomy 21 verse 17 says that the first born receives a double portion of his father's inheritance so in fact the voice in the crowd is asking for more than his accepted entitlement. It seemed to many that Jesus had been going around reinterpreting the laws and so the chancer in the crowd perhaps thought he might receive a sympathetic ruling. Jesus seems to reject the premise of the question and turns the table to speak of the danger of greed in the parable of a rich man. The rich man believed he had 'made it'. Instead of looking forward to a long retirement, God tells the man he is foolish because that very night his life will be forfeited. The implication is that it is not only the man's body that will be lost but his very soul, because he has given up his faith in God and placed his faith instead in material riches and the pursuit of the easy life.

Do we live as if God exists? Do we live as if Jesus died for us? Or do we live like this is all there is and so we had best get our fair share?

Jesus didn't seem to think much of this idea of a fair share. Jesus said things like 'if you have two of something give one away', he said things like 'be kind to people who are mean to you', he said things like love those people around you as if they were a part of you', because they are. When we hurt others, we hurt ourselves; when we pile up riches for ourselves while at the same time seeing others go hungry, we are not rich in God's sight and we are headed for disaster as individuals, as community, as a species.
