# **From Murray**

In the Gospel reading for today we read of the unjust Judge that gets annoyed by the widow that he decides to grant her justice. The reading looks at the connection between faith and Justice. Justice is one of the values of faith in God.

It a profound lesson on the importance of persistence in prayer and the assurance of God's justice. In the parable, Jesus presents a widow who refuses to give up, repeatedly appealing to an indifferent judge for justice. Despite his lack of compassion or respect for anyone, the judge eventually grants her request simply because of her persistence or nagging. Through this story, Jesus encourages us not to lose heart, even when answers to our prayers seem delayed or situations appear hopeless. The widow's unwavering determination is a model for our faith journey, reminding us that perseverance is vital when approaching God with our needs and hopes.

Moreover, the contrast between the unjust judge and God is striking. If even a reluctant human judge eventually acts, how much more will our loving God respond to those who call out to Him day and night? Jesus reassures us that God is attentive and eager to bring justice, though it may not always occur in the way or timing we expect. The closing question—"Will the Son of Man find faith on earth?"—challenges us to examine our own trust and persistence. Are we willing to persist in faith, confident that God hears and cares, even when faced with discouragement? This passage calls us to steadfast prayer and resilient faith, trusting in God's goodness and justice.

It calls us to be active in our collective and individual advocacy for those who are unable to stand up for themselves.

This month marks the 40<sup>th</sup> anniversary of the ordination of the late Bishop Arthur Malcolm as deacon in God's Church. Bishop Arthur was consecrated in 1985 and was Australia's first Aboriginal Bishop. In the 1960s Bishop Arthur served as a Church Army evangelist in Brewarrina NSW where he is fondly remembered to this day. Bishop Arthur cowrote the Reconciliation Prayer for A Prayer Book for Australia with his wife Colleen.
