

"What Do You See?"

When Jesus responds to John the Baptist's disciples in Matthew 11:2-11, He invites them—and us—to truly see beyond appearances and expectations. Instead of giving a direct answer, Jesus points to the evidence of God's work: "the blind receive sight, the lame walk, lepers are cleansed, the deaf hear, the dead are raised, and the good news is preached to the poor." What do I see in this passage? I see a challenge to look for God's presence not only in grand gestures, but also in acts of compassion and transformation. Jesus doesn't fit the mold of a conquering Messiah but rather embodies hope for the marginalised. This reflection calls me to look deeper in my everyday life—to notice kindness, healing, inclusion as signs of God's Kinadom and unfolding. Seeing with faith means recognising God at work where others may not. This is my prayer for the new year, that I might experience the presence and evidence of God in my daily life.
