From Grahame

Following the great celebration of the birth of Jesus, last week we remembered the revealing of the significance of this for whole world in the arrival of travellers from the east, who are said to have been wise men. This week we jump to Matthew chapter 3 and the baptism of Jesus by John in the Jordan, a humble act of faith and turning point in the intentional ministry of Jesus.

Have you found that we humans are really good at twisting things around to suit ourselves? Even Christians... even in speaking of faithfulness. We praise each other for our faithfulness, while quietly or not so quietly hoping that our faithfulness is worthy of the same praise. If we sign up for this rollercoaster ride the dip which surely follows once we put on our seemingly inevitable judgement hat, is that we start to believe we see people that are not measuring up, not faithful enough. We begin to forget how we got to where we are, we begin to believe we did it on our own, we begin to believe we can do it all on our own.

The truth is we are part of something bigger than ourselves. We did not accomplish our coming into being by ourselves and each of our achievements since has been aided or hindered by our relationships: our relationships with each other, our family, our community, and our most important relationship, our relationship with God.

If we stay on the rollercoaster we may fool ourselves into believing that even our salvation is accomplished solely by our act, our decision, our faithfulness, forgetting that it is in fact the faithfulness of God by which we are saved. The faithfulness of God in Christ Jesus, humbly submitting to be baptised by John and living the fully human, simple, everyday life. Then in submitting even to die so that in being raised we may have confidence in the promises of God. We have our part. Yet we can never be free of God's love. Whatever our decision, God's love, God's faithfulness remains. It is by God's faithfulness to us that we may be saved.

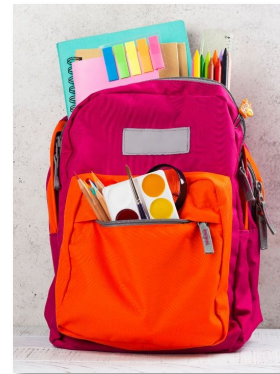
Pray of the Day
