From Grahame

Again, this week our focus Scripture speaks of calling. The first readers of Matthew chapter 4 were trying to cope with change from their traditional lives of faith to something which was far different, but at the same time the fulfilment of the prophecy of their faith. It was what they had been waiting for. The equivalent for us would be if someone came into our worship and proclaimed they were the Second Coming of Christ. This happens more regularly than you may realise, but one day it will be true. How will we cope with that, are we prepared for that?

With the arrest of John the Baptist his public ministry came to an end, and the public ministry of Jesus began. Jesus appeared to take up where John left off, teaching that the 'kingdom of God has come near'. He then goes so much further. Our challenge in 2026 is to discern what this means for us. What does it mean for us to hear that the kingdom of God has come near?

Following Christmas, I hope we have each had some quiet time to reflect and renew. As I have travelled about this new year, I have observed people try to live out their lives in the best way possible and struggling to work out what that meant. When Jesus called the first group of disciples I am confident none of them had any idea of what was to come. They had no concept of the way of life we have in 21st century Australia. This year we will again be challenged to discern and live into God's kingdom of hope, peace, joy and love in our context for the betterment of God's people.

Annual General Meeting

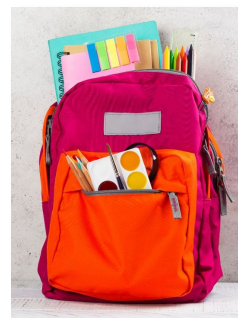
