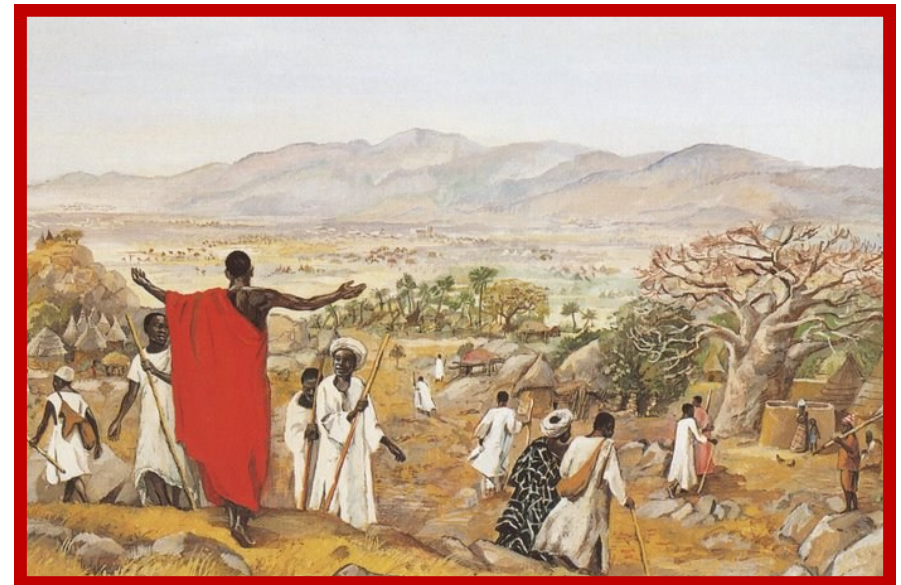

Hospitality! Jesus calls us to be messengers of the Good News and in turn, to receive messengers with acts of hospitality. In Matthew chapter 10, Jesus rounds out his instructions to those he sends out. He tells those who will travel to take nothing with them so that they rely on the hospitality they receive. Can you imagine anything more basic yet at the same time more essential than offering hospitality to travellers who have nothing? Have you ever experienced receiving hospitality when you were in great need? There is nothing quite like it. The good news of Jesus Christ is like that, like shelter and sustenance to someone who would die without it, literally. This is hospitality at its most basic and hospitality is essential to God's great rescue mission for God's people. This is why we share food together regularly, this is why Jesus continues to make himself known to us in the breaking of the bread in worship.

In the context into which Jesus first spoke, a messenger was to be treated with the same regard as the person sending the message. So, when we receive God's messengers or are received, we must remember that we are not acting on our own behalf, the hospitality we receive should not depend on our own abilities and the hospitality we extend to others should not depend on theirs. It is Jesus the Christ who has sent us with God's message on our way, and sends others. Hospitality is essential to the mission of the Church and we each have a part to play.

As we reflect this Refugee Sunday, may we remember what it is like to have little and be ready to offer much.

'Do not forget, never forget, Jesus was a refugee.'

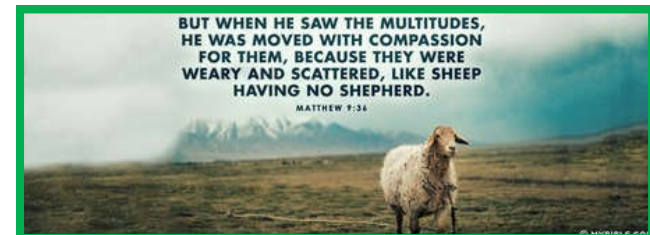
